This policy is in place to ensure that Springwood United Football Club (SUFC) is compliant with Law 4- Players Equipment, sub clause Safety of FIFA Laws of the game.

## **Law 4 - Players Equipment**

A player must not use equipment or wear anything that is dangerous to himself or another player (including any kind of jewellery).

This includes anti-discrimination bands, leather necklaces and any other loose wristbands.

The taping of jewellery is no longer allowed (including earrings and wedding rings).  
Sweatbands may be worn.

## **Exception**

If in the opinion of the Referee, a medical bracelet or medical necklace presents no danger, then it may be allowed on the condition that it can be taped or bandaged to the body to provide protection. A medical bracelet can be covered by a tight wrist guard and similarly, a medical necklace can be sufficiently padded.

It is the policy of SUFC that no jewellery is to be worn by either male or female players representing SUFC in either football (soccer) or netball activities at any venue including any of the following activities whether structured or casual - grading procedures, competition games, trialing, trial games, training or practice.

Any player not complying with these regulations will not be allowed to participate in any of the activities mentioned above.
